Carl Emanuel Hammel, age 91, of Kennewick, WA went to be with the Lord on Friday, August 27, 1993 at Vistavue Care Center. Since their ranch was far from town, the school teacher would occasionally live with the family for the school year.

In 1924, Carl traveled to Graceland College in Lamoni, Iowa and attended for one year.

He married Mabel Rasmussen on October 31, 1925 in North Dakota and they moved to Independence, MO. Carl worked in a tile factory in Independence; the Fisher-Body Plant in Kansas City; and the Sunflower Ordinance Plant.

In 1947, he went to Elmendorf Air Force Base in Anchorage, Alaska, working on construction. After a short time, he returned through Richland, WA and was employed by various contractors at Hanford. He also was a contractor and built homes in this area.

Carl was an elder in the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints and served as pastor of Richland and Pasco congregations, and as district president.

He enjoyed gardening, building and fixing things; caring for animals; and watching and listening to children, especially his grand- and great-grandchildren.

Allan George Miller, 52, passed away May 24, 1992 at Virginia Mason Hospital in Seattle, Washington after a courageous nine-year battle against cancer. With God's help he was victorious. His spirit was never broken and he lived life fully with single-minded pursuit of his goals.

Al was born at Joseph, Oregon on May 3, 1940 to George W. Miller, deceased, and Mable A. Miller. Al married Barbara R. Scott on December 20, 1969. They have three surviving children; Burnie W. Miller, Santa Barbara, CA, Scott Allan Miller and Brenda Rose Miller, Richland, WA. Al has one sister, Elaine Miller Willey, Portland, OR.

Al received his B.S. degree in chemistry from Oregon State University in 1964, after which he worked for G.E. Electric Company at Hanford. Al subsequently worked for all, except Westinghouse, of the Hanford contractors in charge of the Hanford project in Richland, WA.



He received his M.S. degree from the University of Washington in 1971 while on leave of absence from ARCO. While working full-time at Rockwell Hanford Company in 1981, he earned his Ph.D. from the University of Washington. While working as senior research scientist at U.S. Testing Company, Al was involved in building a prototype for a scientific instrument using new technology from Battelle Northwest Laboratories. In 1986 he left that employer to establish his own manufacturing firm, Chemchek Instruments, Inc., Richland, in order to commercialize that same instrument, the Kinetic Phosphorescence Analyzer, which today sells nationally and internationally. The corporation continues under the direction of Barbara Miller and Duane Mullen.

Al has contributed many articles to various professional journals and was considered to be well-published. He has been selected to Marquis' *Who's Who In The West*, 1992. He was a member of the ASTM committees on water and environmental electronics; American Chemical Society (treasurer, 1985); American Association of Clinical Chemistry, International Society of Optical Engineering; Tri-City Chess Club (treasurer since 1977); member of the City of Richland Environmental Commission, 1988.

Al was an active member, and lay minister, of the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints.
